



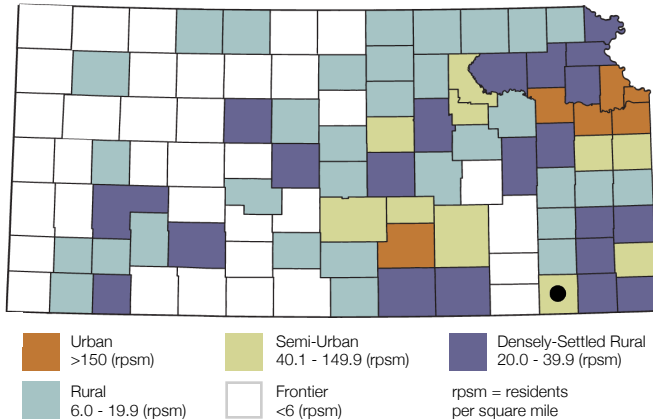

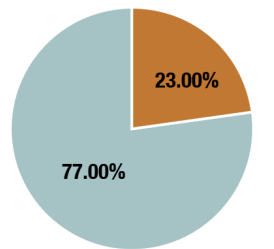
Home ownership among Kansas families with children under 18.

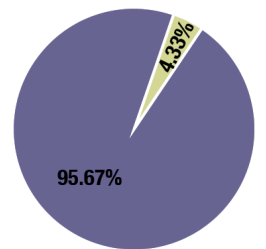
Employment status of Kansas parents with children under 18.
