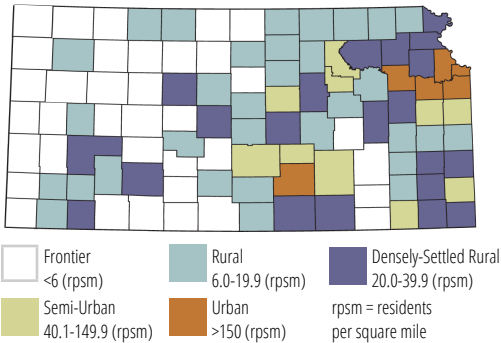

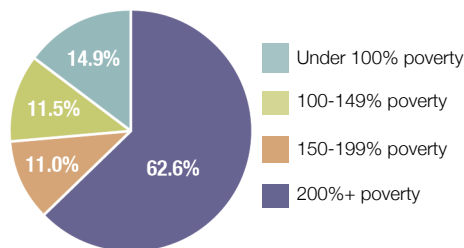

Poverty status of Kansas children under 18.

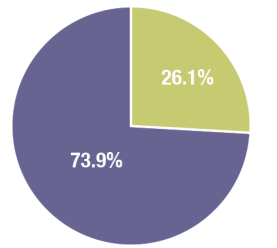

Infants still exclusively breastfeeding at 6 months.

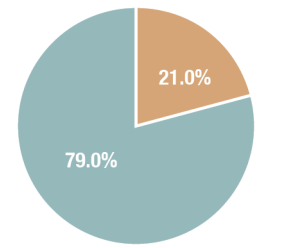


■ Percent of infants still exclusively breastfeeding at 6 months.

Employment status of Kansas parents with children under 18.

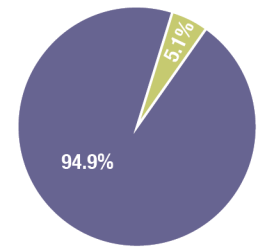


■ Percent of children with no parent working 35+ hours a week for 50 weeks
